



- Somerville Zoning Overhaul a law we can control, within certain limits

- Home Rule Petitions









### Our budget is primarily funded through property taxes.



Of FY19 tax revenue, 93% came from property taxes



# MONEY

Need to balance costs of upgrading/maintaining aging infrastructure with cost of needed infrastructure in transform areas.

#### Water & Sewer System

- 90% of our pipes are 50+ years old
- 70% may be 100+ years old
- \$50M backlog in needed work for water system

## The cost of building housing is higher than ever.







# Our City is already built out into neighborhoods that we really like.







# We like seeing a little development in Enhance districts...










# **Example: Creating Open Space**

- Land: We need to create an additional 105.1 acres to meet the 125 acre
- goal, that would fill 50% of the Transform areas
- **Money:** \$6.2M acre estimate in today's dollars for acquisition, design, and construction of new open space
- Law: Developers can provide open space through Privately Owned Public
- Spaces (POPS), but there legal limits on what the City can require
