What do you love about the Somerville Community? What aspects of Somerville do we want SomerVision 2040 to enhance or preserve?

- Somerville feels like a safe space for immigrants where ICE is not welcome
- Somerville is doing well in terms of commercial development and bringing in movie theaters, and nice restaurants, there is a lot to do
- The city is open to immigrants joining boards and commissions
- The council on aging does a lot of the community
- Haitian cultural festivals help the Haitian community feel included
- City staff is usually friendly and helpful
- The arts council throws great events, and all the festivals around the city do a lot to celebrate our art and culture
- Somerviva goes far and above with helping immigrants, not just with information or translation but also helping them find jobs and get situated
- Historical sites give the city character
- Somerville's Sanctuary policies help the immigrant community feel like the community cares about them



## What problems and challenges affect the Somerville community? Which are the most important to you personally?

- Parking near the Haitian churches for weekend events is consistently a problem
- Housing affordability is the number one problem, many Haitian families who have lived here for many years are getting displaced
- Many Haitian families are living in unsafe situations by having to share living spaces with too many people
- The city needs to do more to inform and help the immigrant community access healthcare and get flu shots
- Wages are too low for workers without college degrees
- Too many people need to commute to other communities to work
- Public meetings don't feel welcoming for the immigrant community
- We don't have enough families in Somerville anymore

## What are some ideas you would like the community to explore? These could be solutions to some of the problems we identified or other programs or initiatives?

- Make sure places for public gathering like churches have enough parking
- The city should further explore sister city relationships with Haiti to increase cultural exchange
- The city could have even more festival and events that are culturally themed with entertainment to see, people will go
- We need to make policies that attract and encourage raising families in Somerville more of a priority, our population of family with kids is disappearing
- As the city attracts more wealthy people everything is becoming more expensive, it's not just housing cost, we need to address the affordability or our retail too
- We should have more public meetings aimed directly at immigrants
- We need to create more jobs locally, so less people have to commute
